Brown strip gained fame, John A Bush purchased rights to the name and character for the Brown Shoe Company, which was started in 1878 by George Warren Brown and two partners Before long. many of us were wearing Buster Brown shoes during our grammar-school years

FUDGEY CHOCOLATE BROWNIES

3/4 cup all-purpose flour 1/4 teaspoon baking powder 4-1/2 tablespoons butter 9 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa

3/4 cup granulated sugar 1/3 cup light-brown sugar 2 large eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Dlace oven tack in lower third of oven Preheat oven to 325°F Grease and flour an 8x8-inch pan

Mix flour and baking powder Melt butter in a saucepan, stir in cocoa and sugars, and cool Add eggs and vanilla to saucepan mix, then add flour, stirring

until smooth Pour into pan and bake for 15 minutes. (Toothpick inserted will not come out clean)

Makes 16 brownies.


