Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 3.00 lower. April live futures closed 17 points firmer Monday, possibly due to a combination of last Friday's cattle on feed report and fading attention on the Florida woman with human form of mad cow disease over the weekend. However, declining prices on live cattle over the past few weeks did little to lend support for feeders. and left buyers and sellers in a tough situation as they are looking for direction, with no clear answers.

up in the southern plains Thursday after-


