WASHINGTON, D.C., May 10 - (USDA-NASS) - Total red meat production under federal inspection for the week ending Sat., May 11, was estimated at 895.6 million lbs., according to the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. This was 3.1% lower than a week ago and 2.6% higher than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 2.6% higher compared to the previous year.

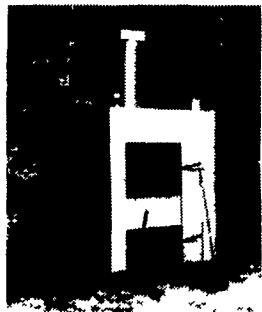
