were being advertised at 69 cents per dozen. Supplies were fully adequate for needs. The New York shell egg inventories decreased 22 percent and the New Jersey shell egg inventories were 28 percent less than a week ago.

Movement into all channels was light to moderate, better where retail ads and fast food promotions were present, and also where seasonal interest was active. Supplies were balanced to closely cleared on light weights, at least adequate on heavier sizes. In parts of the Midwest, heavy rains and floods caused delays or cancellations of deliveries in spot areas.

In the parts structure, trading was limited with most needs met and regular commitments sufficient. Availability of all parts was more than adequate or available with some discounting on breast items noted to help clear. In production

areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy, mostly desirable.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate and clearing the market at a reasonable rate. Demand was moderate with average buyer interest and trading. Live supplies was moderate to light for the market being reported with an esti-

mated slaughter of 1,366,000 compared to 1,354,000 last Tuesday. Weights were light to desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Actual slaughter for 5/6-5/11 was 6,887,346 with an average weight of 4.86. Supply of wings are heavy and above average for the market being reported while the demand is moderate with average buyer interest and trading.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at .47-.59 per pound, less than trucklot sales .48-.67 per pound.
