Seller offerings continued to vary in both size and volume and were clearing satisfactorily at most plants. Live supplies were moderate; weights were irregular in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 58 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, all items remained at least adequate for current inquiry.

Trade sentiment was steady on whites, but improving, and the balance of items was fully steady to firm. Demand was generally moderate to good. Supplies where available were held with confidence. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending June 1, 2002 were 11% lower than the previous week, but 34% higher than a year ago.

The trade sentiment on tom drums was mixed with some sellers confident in the market while others find unaggressive buyer inquiry. The market on tom 2-joint wings was steady to fully steady, tom full-cut wings steady and tom necks and tails steady to barely steady. Offerings of tom drums ranged light to fully adequate mostly adequate, tom 2-joint wings light, tom full-cut wings adequate, and tom necks mostly adequate to fully adequate. The hen parts market tone ranged from steady to firm on 2-joints to mostly steady on the balance of items. Offerings of hen 2-joint wings were light at best and held with confidence, light to adequate on the balance of items. Trade sentiment on fresh mechanically separated turkey was steady to fully steady with some noting offers not as tight as previous weeks. Trading was light on all items.

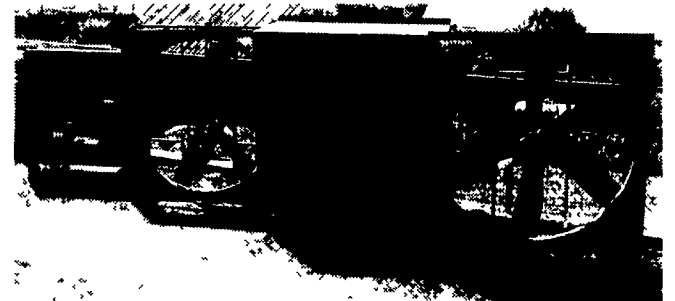

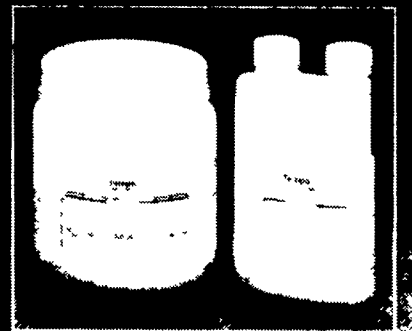
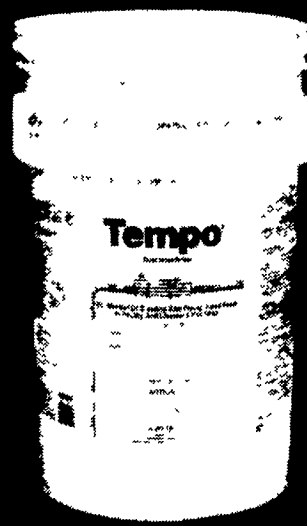
