Virginia Broilers And Fryers

Harrisonburg, Va. June 18, 2002 Report Supplied By USDA

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was moderate and clearing the market at a reasonable rate. Demand was moderate with buyer interest and trading. Live supplies was moderate for the market being reported with an estimated slaughter of 1.325,000 compared to 1.322,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Supply and demand of bone-in breast was good with trading more active than normal. Actual slaughter for 6/10-6/15 was 6,731,358 head with an average weight of 4.94.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier ice-packed broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at .50 -.66 per pound; less than trucklot sales .55 -.73 per pound.

NATIONAL CANNER FOWL MAR-KET: Majority of prices were unchanged to slightly lower on both light and heavy canners when compared to week earlier. Offerings ranged from about adequate to fully adequate. Demand was mostly light to moderate. The undertone was generally about steady to steady.

Cents per pound, current negotiations with out freight cost: LIGHT CANNER HENS: Line run without necks: 20-25, majority - 21-22. HEAVY CANNER HENS: Without necks: 30-38 mostly 31-32.

Trade sentiment was overall no better than steady. Retail demand was limited to fair, best for scattered features. Food service was light to moderate, strongest into fast food and catering businesses. Supplies were more than adequate to satisfy trade needs. In the parts structure, trading was fair at best with seasonal interest and specials frequently aiding movement, but present inventories were usually sufficient. Bone-in breasts were in good balance, and the remaining parts were at least adequate or available. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at desirable to heavy, mostly desirable weights.
