The 4-H Fashion Show will be presented by youth sewers at 3 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 10, during the Fair. Youth may also partici-


pate in the "Express Yourself Scrap Revue," by using scraps from the Fabric Sale. Everyone wins a ribbon for participating.




