Processing schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 58 to 72 cents. Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, all items were at least adequate. Breast cuts were in good balance to fully adequate. Leg quarters were fully adequate to ample.

Supplies were adequate to available. Breaking stock offerings were usually adequate for the light to moderate demand. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample.

NATIONAL YOUNG TURKEY PARTS AND BULK MEAT, Frozen, unless specified, cents per lb, delivered first receivers, part and full trucklots, as of June 19, 2002.

Trade sentiment on fresh tom breast meat and fresh destrapped tenderloins was steady to fully steady. Demand was slow to moderate. Offerings of fresh tom breast meat ranged light to adequate and fresh destrapped tenderloins were light. Market activity was slow on frozen tom breast meat and destrapped tenderloins with a steady to instances fully steady undertone. Offerings available. Trade sentiment on frozen scapula and wing meat was barely steady at best with wing meat in the softest position, breast trim about steady. Demand for white meat trims was slow for the adequate to ample offerings. Trading centered on a light volume of frozen thigh meat for export. Export interest ranged slow to moderate with interest noted for Russia for prompt shipments and for Mexico. Some export buyers for Russia and Mexico remained cautious while they wait for clarification of import requirements. Frozen Grade a 16-18 lb. WOGS traded at 67 cents delivered current.
