MOLLY PITCHER

June 28 marks the anniversary of the Battle of Monmouth, New Jersey, in 1778, when Mary Ludwig Hays earned the name Molly Pitcher. Her husband served as an artillery man in the conflict. In the severe heat and combat activity, the guns and the soldiers needed water to cool them off. Twenty-one year-old Molly made trip after trip from a nearby spring, responding to the calls of "Molly, pitching!" across the battlefield. Some say that when her husband was fatally wounded, she took up the ramrod and assumed his post for the remainder of the battle. She later remarried in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, where she was buried as Mary Hays McCaully. A cannon and flag mark her grave.

CORN CUSTARD (A COLONIAL MAINSTAY)

2 cups corn kernels, fresh or canned (drained)
1/4 cup flour
1 teaspoon sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
3 eggs, beaten
2 cups milk
2 tablespoons butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350°F. Mix corn with dry ingredients. Add eggs, milk, and butter. Bake for 50 to 60 minutes in a buttered baking dish (8x8-inch or similar) or casserole dish that's set in a pan of water. When a knife inserted in the center comes out clean it's done.
