 Trade sentiment was about steady to barely steady. Retail demand was mixed, but overall no better than moderate with features. Food service was fair to good with increased interest into fast food and resort areas preparing for holiday crowds. Supplies of all sizes were balanced to ample and frequently discounted to help move. In the parts structure, trading was light and selective with regular commitments usually sufficient or purchasing limited to immediate needs only. Availability of all parts was at least adequate or obtainable. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were in a full range, but mostly desirable.

The 12-City Weighted Average Price for 07/01/02 was 57.38, compared to 58.37 last week, and 60.12 a year ago.

 The market continued seasonally slow on commodity items. Inquiry was light at best on bulk white meat items for various holiday processing schedule fill-in needs. Some further processors were noting increased deli and cooked movement as a partial response to the recent warmer weather in parts of the country and the upcoming holiday. Some processors were also starting to indicate some minor ramifications caused by the recent heat wave on the live side. The export market continued slow as the industry continued to watch for developments in Russia and Asia.
