CHEDDAR CHEESE prices received for US 40 pound Blocks averaged \$1.15 per pound for the week ending June 22. The price per pound decreased 2.0 cents from the previous week. The price for US 500 pound Barrels adjusted to 38 percent moisture averaged \$1.13 per pound, down 1.4 cents from the previous week.

BUTTER prices received for 25 kilogram and 68 pound boxes meeting USDA Grade AA standards averaged \$1.00 per pound for the week ending June 22. The U.S. price per pound decreased 6.2 cents from the previous week.
