After sharp gains the past couple of days, grain and soybean bids were lower. The reins were pulled back, as rainfall chances later in the week and again early next week over the major growing areas forecasted. However, traders are leery about jumping the gun without actual proof of evidence along with growing concerns over harvest yields and overall production. Wheat 2 to 3 cents lower, with Kansas City 1 cent higher. Corn 2 to 5 cents lower. Soybeans 3 to 6 cents lower, as much as 9 cents lower in Kansas City. Sorghum 2 to 5 cents higher.
