The New York shell egg inventories decreased 8 percent and the New Jersey shell egg inventories were 28 percent less than last week.

Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending July 6 were 15% less than the previous week, but 3% more than a year ago.

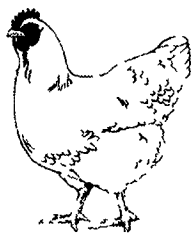
