Tom bulk parts trade sentiment was barely steady at best on drums and necks, wings steady to barely steady. Demand ranged slow to instances moderate, best on drums for export. Offerings ranged adequate to ample with tom 2-joint wings in the best position. Hen bulk parts undertone was steady to firm on 2-joints, balance about steady. Demand was light to instances fair, best on 2-joints. Offerings of hen 2-joint wings were limited and held with confidence, balance about adequate. Domestic trading slow. Export trading centered on a moderately light volume of tom drums.

readily available, competitively priced and slow to clear. Live supplies were seasonally moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were moderate to moderately. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 52 to 64 cents. Trade sentiment remained weak. In the parts complex, buying interest surfaced in spots on boneless skinless breasts, however, supplies remained fully sufficient. Other cuts were generally reported in a range of fully adequate to readily available and difficult to clear.
