• Thursday, Sept. 19. John Stoltzfus farm, Parkesburg, located north of Rt. 30 and west of Rt. 10 at 7643 N. Moscow Rd. John is a certified organic producer with 50 acres of grass and 11 years of grazing experience. He milks 50 cows and feeds a mixture of grass and TMR. Lunch will be provided.

• Thursday, Oct. 10. Jake Zook farm, located southwest of Christiana at 1178 White Oak Rd., between Noble Rd. and Bartville Rd. Jake has nine years of grazing experience and 100 acres of grass. He milks 50 cows and feeds no grain. A light lunch and drinks will be provided.
