Trucklot buying activity was very limited during midweek trading. Offerings of boneless-skinless breasts were generally sufficient and bone-in breasts were at least adequate. Dark meat cuts were readily available and wings remained ample. Movement through retail and distributive channels was sluggish. The market tone was steady at best on breast items, weak on wings and no better than steady on the balance.

Prices were unchanged in all areas. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand into all channels ranged light to very good, best where featured and in resort or vacation areas. Supplies were adequate to barely adequate on the larger sizes while the lighter weights were usually adequate to fully adequate. Breaking stock offerings were mostly sufficient for the moderate to good demand. Light type hens were fully adequate to ample.

Mostly prices were unchanged on whites, unchanged to slightly higher on whole and salt yolk, and irregular on sugar yolks when compared to last week's trading. Trade sentiment generally improved. Demand was a little more active but still only fair. Supplies were sufficient on most items. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending July 20, were 3% more than the previous week, and unchanged from a year earlier.

Cooperators estimate orders for the week ending Aug. 2, will increase by 9 percent. Present week purchases for the week ending July 26 were 254,892 cases which was 7 percent below the prior week and 3 percent above estimates.

CASES PURCHASED: CARTONED: 211,779, down 9%; LOOSE: 43,113 — up 3%; TOTAL: 254,892 — down 7%.

Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 17 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.

DOMESTIC MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: The market tone was steady on

hens, steady to instances barely steady on 16-24 lb toms. Demand was light and trading centered on spot loads. Offerings were mixed. Supplies of bulk meat and parts were sufficient for the light demand. The USDA Turkey Taco Filling Purchase Program was announced on Tuesday, July 30. Offers from approved suppliers are due by noon, Central Time, Monday, August 26, 2002.

EXPORT MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: Trading was light, mostly tom drums. Demand was most active for Russian approved thigh meat, although some sellers were cautious about resuming exports to Russia.

Trade sentiment was no better than steady to weak. Retail demand was slow to fair with few features, but some optimism was noted for first of the month business. Food service was light to moderate, best for fast food promotions and catering services. Supplies of all sizes were more than sufficient to easily satisfy trade needs. In the parts structure, breast items were balanced to at times tight and moving well, but wings remained fully adequate to ample and discounted. Dark meat was readily available with mixed interest; however, a strong undertone was reported due to the ongoing export dispute possible being resolved. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at weights in a full range, but mostly desirable.

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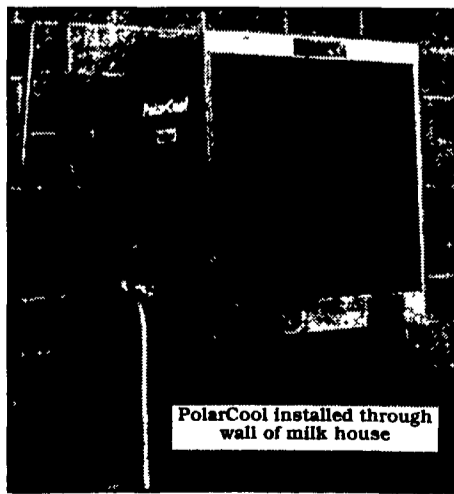
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
