The rainfall that moved across the Midwest was spotty dropping 3 inches here, .25 inch there, but basically disappointing thus lending support. Rainfall has now moved into the Eastern Cornbelt which could come into play on Thursday's markets. Concern still lies over yields and speculation over yet lower production estimates in September. Warmer temperatures are now back in the forecast taking away the relief. Wheat steady to 3 cents higher. Corn 5 to 7 cents
