NATIONAL YOUNG TURKEY PARTS AND BULK MEAT, Frozen, unless specified, cents per lb, delivered first receivers, part and full trucklots, as of August 13, 2002.

The undertone on fresh tom breast meat was steady to fully steady for immediate needs, balance of fresh white meat steady. Demand light to instances fair with best inquiry noted on fresh tom breast meat for prompt shipments. Offerings of fresh tom breast meat ranged from instances ample in the West to light to adequate, depending on desired delivery time frames. The frozen white meat undertone was steady to instances weak with scapula and frozen destrapped tenderloins steadiest. Frozen white meat demand was slow for the adequate to ample offerings. Domestic and export trading centered on a moderate volume of fresh mechanically separated turkey, balance light. Fresh wing meat traded at 54-57 mostly 56, Grade A non-basted 16-20 lb. breasts 105 cents delivered.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds continued seasonally fair. Offerings were generally adequate with the larger sizes noted as in the closer better balance. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to light. Processing schedules were curtailed in instances where sizes were lighter than desired, but overall operations remained moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 48 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. Inquiry for wings was active at some points and tenders were in demand. Other cuts were usually noted as at least adequate or available.
