ANSWER — Helen Mac-Kinney sent information requested about penny rugs: "No one knows for sure when or where penny rugs came into use. The rugs can be documented back to the American Civil War, but many have come into being well before. Today, penny rugs refer to wool-on-wool applique, generally using a blanket, whipstitch or other simple embroidery stitch. The use was decorative in nature, put on tabletops or sofa backs. The tabs are referred to as tongues, the circles are the pennies, often thought to be named for the coins used as templates and traced onto wool scraps used to make the rugs."
