LEBANON (Lebanon Co.) — Chanelle Horst's senior 3-year-old cow, Ju-Vindale Jolt Apricot, was named grand champion in both youth and open divisions at the recent Southeast Pennsylvania Holstein Championship Show.

Apricot is the first district champion exhibited by Horst in her eight-year show career. Apricot was bred by Vince and Juliet Wagner and was also named reserve champion Holstein at the Lebanon Fair Holstein Youth Show three weeks ago.

Horst is a student at Elco High School and lives on the 50-cow dairy farm of her parents, Kirby and Sheryl Horst, Newmans-town.

Bryant Hlavaty's cow, Keystone Padre Leigh, also a senior 3-year-old, was named youth and open reserve champion and best bred and owned of the show. Hlavaty hails from Keystone Farm, Easton, Northampton County.

David Vail, Lebanon, led his winter yearling, Dalee-Bred Durham Princess, to the junior championship of the open show.

Andrew Youtz, 7, exhibited the reserve junior champion and youth junior champion, a winter calf named Favreautiere Igniter Pamtouf.

It was Youtz's first year in the show ring. Parents Jim and Sue Younker manage Kirbyville Holsteins, Fleetwood.

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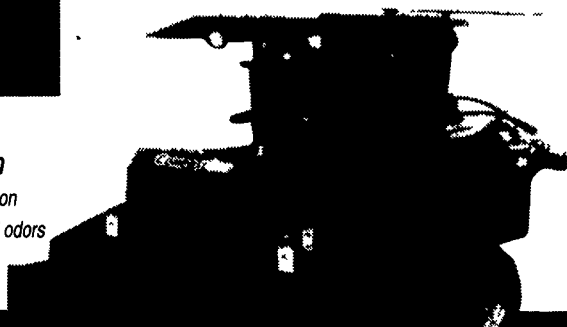
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
