Mostly prices were unchanged to slightly higher on whites and ranged from unchanged to lower on the balance of products when compared to previous week's trading. The market tone improved at the lower levels but was still in a steady to barely steady position. Trading and demand was only fair. Supplies were irregular but usually available if needed. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending August 24, 2002 were unchanged from the previous week, but 2% lower than a year ago.
