Receipts: 676 Last week: 281 Last Year: 385 Compared to last week, a small test of feeder pigs sold fully steady as the majority of the supply continues to go to slaughter. Demand remains good for slaughter pigs as receipts were more than doubled when compared to last week. Slaughter pigs weighing from 20-50 lbs sold 5.00 to 15.00 higher, with heavier pigs not tested due to last weeks short supply of 85-95 pounders. Midwest terminal hog markets are reporting steady to firm prices on Wednesday, ranging from 26.50-30.00 for hogs weighing from 230-270 pounds; with lean hog futures rallying up-the-limit Tuesday, the fat hog market may have finally found its bottom. Around 11 percent of the run returned to feed. All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weights.

Compared to the last market test of two weeks ago, barrows and gilts sold with a weaker undertone on a light run. Bidding was only moderate to begin the sale, however buyers were much more willing to procure the better quality hogs late in the sale. After bringing sharply lower prices over the past few weeks, sows weighing over 500 lbs sold 2.00-3.00 higher, with 300-500 lb sows trading steady to 1.00 higher. A small test of boars sold steady to 1.00 lower.
