Midwest terminal hog markets are reporting steady to firm prices on Wednesday, ranging from 26.50-30.00 for hogs weighing from 230-270 pounds; with lean hog futures rallying up-the-limit Tuesday, the fat hog market may have finally found its bottom. Around 11 percent of the run returned to feed. All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weights.
