In Philadelphia, prices were unchanged to 2 cents higher on all sizes. In Boston, prices were unchanged to 1 cent higher on mediums and unchanged on the larger sizes. Prices paid to producers in New England were 2 cents higher on extra large and large, unchanged on the remainder of sizes. The market tone was fully steady to firm. Demand into all channels was light to moderate, best where featured. In the Philadelphia vicinity, large eggs were advertised at buy one get one free. Supplies were adequate to in close balance. Breaking stock demand was fair and offerings were fully sufficient. Light type fowl were fully adequate for slaughter requirements.

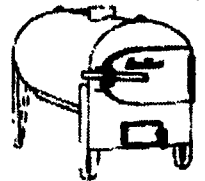
