Compared to last Monday, barrows and gilts sold 3.00-5.00 higher in very active trading. Butchers weighing in the 200-250 lb range were in very good demand, trading sharply higher, with other weight classes not far behind. Higher terminal hog prices over the past couple of weeks and a firmer futures Board, have coupled to bring a breath of fresh air to the slaughter market. However, terminal markets are reporting weaker bids as of Monday, with private analysts expecting another dip in prices before the week draws to a close.

Compared to last week, a light run of feeder pigs sold with a sharply lower undertone as many pig feeders remain extremely cautious in the face of a volatile slaughter hog market. Lighter weight 20-30 lb slaughter pigs sold mostly 13.00 lower, with 40-80 lb pigs trading fully steady to firm in fairly active trading. However, slaughter pigs weighing over 80 lbs were also pressured, trading with a definite weaker undertone. Receipts were nearly 200 head lighter this week when compared to last, as most producers are waiting for more market sta-
