

Five Colored Breeds Shown At Solanco

QUARRYVILLE (Lancaster Co.) — Ayrshires appeared in the largest numbers at the Southern Lancaster County Fair's Colored Breeds Dairy Show here Wednesday, followed by the Brown Swiss, Milking Shorthorn, Line-

back, and Jersey breeds. Judge Ronald Ray Daubert named a cow exhibited by Susan Richardson as the grand champion Ayrshire. Four-year-old Fawn Valley Soldier Harmony was one of five Ayrshires Richardson brought to the show. "I love the balance of this cow," Daubert said. He also

noted the "nice, neat mammary system" displayed by the champion Ayrshire.

Richardson, of Fawn Grove in York County, is in her second year as a dairy herd management major at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. She has her sights set on becoming a dairy herdsman in the Midwest.

Rebecca Baily, Chester County, exhibited two grand champions — in the Brown Swiss and Lineback shows. Baily is a member of the Chester Valley 4-H Club and a freshman at Unionville High School. She owns a total of about 20 dairy animals on the home farm, including a majority of Linebacks, but also Brown Swiss, Jerseys, and Holsteins.

The Milking Shorthorn show was dominated by the Crowl family of Airville, York County. Animals owned by Heather Crowl, in her final year as an FFA member, swept both junior and senior champion and reserve categories. The grand champion Milking Shorthorn cow, a 6-year-old, was exhibited by Heather's father, Ellis Crowl.

A 3-year-old Jersey owned by Stormi Greek and exhibited by

Lisa Jones, Delta, York County, was named Jersey grand champion.

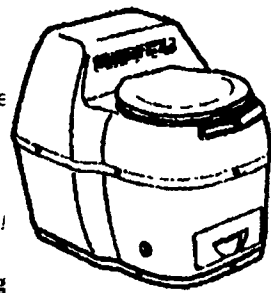

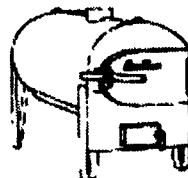
