Deer Processing Workshop Planned

HONESDALE (Wayne Co.) -With the start of archery season right around the corner, followed by other hunting seasons, many area hunters are turning their thoughts to deer hunting. While the hunt is greatly anticipated, the care and handling of game after the hunt can be a daunting task. The first and most important steps to having good tasting venison is the proper field dressing of your deer and safe handling of the meat after harvest.


To help hunters prepare for the upcoming seasons, Penn State Cooperative Extension in Wayne County and the Pennsylvania Game Commission are sponsoring a workshop on the care and processing of deer after harvest. The workshop will be Thursday, Sept. 26 from 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the Wayne County Fairgrounds, Route 191, one mile north of Honesdale.

The workshop will feature a field dressing demonstration by Wildlife Conservation Officer with the PA Game Commission Frank Dooley. Rudy Reers, a local deer processor, will then lead a demonstration on processing a deer from field to freezer.

Dr. Bushan Jayaro, Penn State Extension veterinarian, will conclude the workshop with a discussion of diseases affecting whitetail deer, including chronic wasting disease, which is a new threat to Pennsylvania deer.




