Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 48 to 62 cents. Trade sentiment was weak and unsettled. In the parts complex, supplies were more than sufficient for current requirements.

In Philadelphia, prices were unchanged to 1 cent lower on the larger sizes and unchanged to 2 cents lower on mediums. In Boston, prices were unchanged to 1 cent lower on large and unchanged to 2 cents lower on mediums. Prices paid to producers in New England were 1 cent lower for large, 2 cents lower on medium, and unchanged on the balance of sizes. The market tone was barely steady. Demand ranged light to moderate, slightly better where limited features were in progress.

In the Philadelphia area, large eggs were advertised at 49 cents per dozen. Supplies of all sizes were adequate or available. Breaking stock offerings were sufficient for the light demand. Light type hens were mostly fully adequate for slaughter schedules.

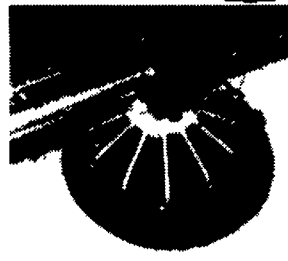

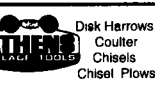
