Compared to last week, a feeder pig trend was not established due to low receipts over the past few weeks. However, local interest is starting to pick back up: with out of state feeders still not able to procure pigs due to the psudo-rabies outbreak of a couple weeks ago. Slaughter pigs weighing under 50 lbs sold weak to 10.00 lower, with pigs weighing over 50 lbs not fully tested. Bidding was very sporadic and only moderate at best. Buvers were definitely selective on the grades, as the higher quality hogs sold at a definite premium to the number twos. Near 17 percent of the run returned to feed. All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weights.
