Mostly prices were unchanged to slightly lower on whole and sugar yolk, and unchanged on other items when compared to previous week's trading. The market tone was unsettled and cautious. Demand was light to moderate. Offerings were adequate to fully adequate on whole and usually adequate on other items. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending September 28, 2002 were 3% more than the previous week, but 4% less than a year ago.

DOMESTIC MARKET HIGH-LIGHTS: The trade sentiment for 8-16 lbs hens steady with lighter weights held with confidence. Toms 16-24 lbs about steady. Offerings were mixed with light weight hen short of requirements. Trading was very limited. Bulk meats and parts trading was slow on all items. Demand remains a no-show as buyers continue to take a wait and see attitude.

EXPORT MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: Trading activity slow. Demand cautious and selective as buyers continue to watching the west coast port closures and also wait for the release of permits from Mexico.
