 losses today due to harvest pressure
 and technical selling in the pits.
 Corn bids were slightly lower due to
 pressure from lower wheat and soy-
 beans. Good weather conditions in
 the harvest areas are weighing on the
 market. Traders are waiting to see
 the USDA crop production report to
 be released on Friday morning.
 Wheat was mostly 5-10 cents lower
 with the exception of Portland
 steady to 1 cent higher. Corn mostly
 1-2 cents lower.

Soybeans 10-13 cents lower. Sorg-
 hum 2-3 cents lower.
