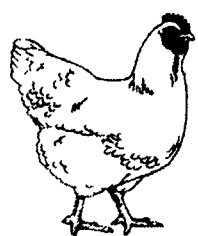

 Report Supplied By USDA  
 Trade sentiment was at least steady in  
 the East, generally steady elsewhere. Retail  
 demand was slow to fair with limited  
 ad activity. Food service was light to  
 moderate, best where fast food specials  
 were active. Supplies of heavier weights  
 were well balanced in the East with some  
 premiums, but ample in the West; smaller  
 sizes were adequate. In the parts structure,  
 trading was mixed. Breast items  
 were in the best balance, at time closely  
 cleared for bone-in. Dark meat was fully  
 sufficient, and wings were in the longest  
 position with little interest. In production  
 areas, live supplies were moderate.  
 Weights were in a full range.
