Fleshier cows were in fairly short supply, although the demand for good Breaking cown was definitely there The run consisted of primarily lean cows, and buyers had there work cut out for them as they sorted through the various qualities. Slaughter bulls were in very light supply, and sold with a weaker undertone on the very light test. The supply included 47 percent steers, 9 percent heifers, 41 percent cows, 2 ent bulls, with the balance feeders. months on feed, and in turn a couple hundred more pounds and they will be Choice or Prime This speculation may pay off, as the February live cattle contract at the CME is nearly to the 77 00 mark, with many analysts expecting an increase in live cattle prices this winter. There were a few slaughter heifers on offer, although with hardly any on Tuesday's market, a trend was not established Holstein steers were also com-pared to a light run on Tuesday, with the Choice supply trending mostly steady.
