CASES PURCHASED: CARTONED: 227,975 — up 3%; LOOSE: 42,564 — up 4%; TOTAL: 270,539 — up 3%.

Trade sentiment was barely steady in the West, steady in the Midwest, steady at best in the East. Demand was seasonally slow to fair, instances moderate for ads and fast food promotions, but strongest where holiday needs and interests took

precedence. Supplies of all sizes were at least adequate to easily handle limited needs. In the parts structure, trading was light and selective. Wings moved into a better position with supplies closer balanced. Dark meat and breast items were adequate to fully sufficient with discounts noted on bone-in breasts. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at desirable to heavy weights.

The 12-City Weighted Average Price for 11/11/02 was 53.01, compared to 54.11 last week, and 59.30 a year ago.
