

Live supplies was moderate for the market being reported with an estimated slaughter of 1,204,000 compared to 1,294,000 last Tuesday. Weights were desirable. Processing schedules were moderate. Actual slaughter for the week of 11/4-11/8/02 was 6,474,973 head with an average weight of 5.04. Supply of breast are heavy and above average while demand is moderate for the market being reported.

Negotiated F.O.B. dock prices, 2 pounds and heavier icepacked broilers and fryers, trucklot sales of US Grade A or equivalent were steady at .42 -.57 per pound; less than trucklot sales .46 -.65 per pound.
