Mostly prices were irregular; generally whites were unchanged, whole unchanged to a tad higher, salt yolk higher but sugar yolk unchanged to slightly lower when compared to last week's trading. The market tone was reported as cautiously steady. Demand was mostly light to occasionally moderate. Offerings were sufficient, but usually held for higher levels as raw breaking costs trended higher. Liquid and frozen eggs (ingredients included) processed under federal inspection in the Eastern region for the week ending November 02, 2002 were 6% higher than the previous week and 7% more than a year ago.

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was slowing as buyer interest turned to turkeys and other items typically traded in advance of the upcoming thanksgiving holiday. Offerings were adequate to ample and more readily available on the 2.5 and 4.0 pound and heavier weights. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processor schedules were moderate to moderately heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 48 to 62 cents. Trade sentiment was barely steady. Bone-in breasts were ample and slow to clear. Boneless skinless breast, leg quarters and wings were at least adequate.

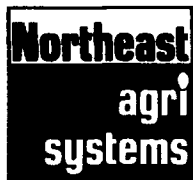

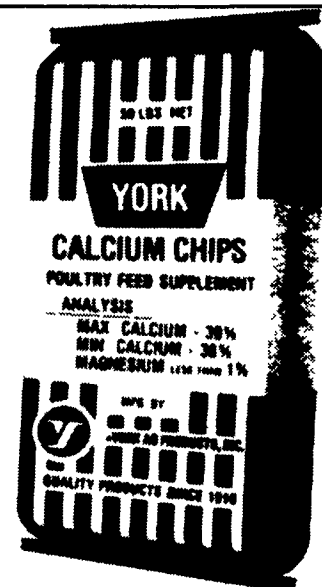
