National Slaughter Cattle Summary -Week Ending Nov 15, 2002 Slaughter cattle sold another 1.00 higher on live basis and 3.00 higher dressed basis. Packer demand good as competition for open market cattle crept into the market place. A modest decline in the numbers of formula cattle has improved seller's position in negotiations and this expected to continue into next week. Improvement in boxed beef figures late in the week eased packer concerns about negative margins. USDA's boxed beef cut-out values Thursday averaged 110.17 up 2.99 from last Friday. Sales of slaughter cattle on a national basis for negotiated cash trades totaled 135,100 through 2:00 p.m. Thursday. Last weeks full count was 122,900.

BOXED BEEF CUTS: Boxed beef sharply higher on moderate demand and light offerings. Select and Choice rib, chuck, round, and loin cuts higher. Beef trimmings sharply higher on a light test.

Estimated composite cutout value of Choice 1-3, 600-750 lbs carcasses up 3.12 at 118.78, 750-900 lbs up 4.11 at 118.68; Select 1-3, 600-750 lbs up 3.32 at 114.61, 750-900 lbs up 2.50 at 111.86; based on 143.04 loads of Choice cuts, 113.81 loads

of Select cuts, 9.83 loads of trimmings, and 58.11 loads of coarse ground trimmings

By-Product Drop Value: Hide and offal from a typical slaughter steer was estimated at 7.69, up .06.
