CORN BELT FEEDSTUFF: Wholesale Bids. Truck or Rail dollars per ton. Feedstuff prices were mixed this past week and demand was slow. Several Producers lower prices to spur interest. Distillers dried grains were steady to weak. The recent advances in corn and soybean trade lent some strength to Gluten meal and soybean meal.

SOYBEAN MEAL: 48 percent rail was 3.50 to 4.50 higher from 161.00-166.00. 48 percent truck was 3.50 higher at 165.00-173.00 per ton.

CORN BY-PRODUCTS: Gluten Feed 21 percent, Interior Points was steady to 2.00 Lower at 66.00-70.00; Chicago was steady at 68.00-72.00. 60 percent Gluten Meal, Interior Points steady to 10.00 higher from 250.00-265.00; Chicago was 10.00 higher from 245.00-265.00 per ton. Rail Hominy Feed, Central Illinois Points was steady from 62.00-80.00; truck was steady from 64.00-80.00. Crude Corn Oil was 25 points higher from 27.00-27.75 cents per pound.

MILLFEEDS: Northwest was steady to 2.00 higher from 75.00-78.00; Buffalo Steady from 60.00-65.00 per ton.

ALFALFA PELLETS: Toledo, Ohio 17 percent dehydrated steady from 145.00-182.00; meal steady from 148.50-185.50. 15 percent meal was steady from 134.00-179.50 per ton; meal steady from 137.50-183.00.
