In Philadelphia, prices were unchanged to two cents lower on mediums and unchanged on the larger sizes. In Boston and New Fngland, prices remained unchanged. The market tone ranged steady to barely steady. Demand into all channels was moderate to good, best into Thanksgiving feature activity. Supplies were adequate to available on white eggs, however brown eggs were reported as tight. Breaking stock offerings were short. to fully adequate for the light to good demand. Offerings of light type hens were sufficient for slaughter requirements.
