DOMESTIC MARKET HIGHLIGHTS  
The undertone on fresh and frozen whole turkeys was at least steady in Midwest and East, mixed in the West. Retail Thanksgiving movement, as reported by buyers, ranged from fair to good with some noting fresh demand was not as aggressive as last year and better than anticipated frozen activity. A last minute call on frozen toms before Thanksgiving had also resulted in better than anticipated movement into consumer channels. Retail whole turkey demand for the December holidays ranged light to instances good. Frozen offerings ranged from tight in the East with size availability varying by packer to mixed in the West. Bulk meat trading centered on fresh tom breast meat at steady to lower trending prices and on fresh mechanically separated turkey.

EXPORT MARKET HIGHLIGHTS:  
Inquiry was light to instances fair with continued buyer cautiousness noted. Interest was noted mostly from Asia, Eastern Europe and Mexico. Trading light at barely steady at best price levels.
