DOMESTIC MARKET HIGH-LIGHTS The undertone on fresh and frozen whole turkeys was at least steady in Midwest and East, mixed in the West. Retail Thanksgiving movement, as reported by buyers, ranged from fair to good with some noting fresh demand was not as aggressive as last year and better than anticipated frozen activity. A last minute call on frozen toms before Thanksgiving had also resulted in better than anticipated movement into consumer channels.
