firm after the holiday shortened week.
Shut downs tightened inventories but
many users were prepared for the clos-
ings. Winter is here as colder tempera-
tures move across the US and supplement-
al feeding increasing. Soybean meal
showed some strength due to higher
Board trading in soybeans over the past
couple of weeks.

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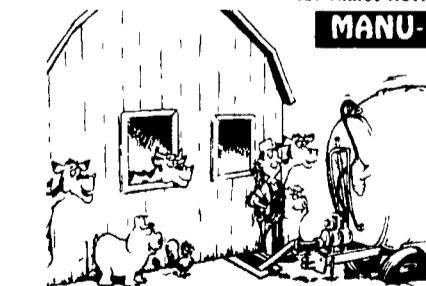
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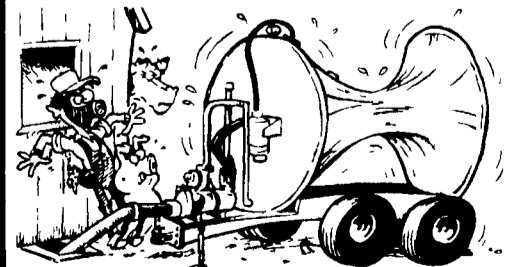
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
