FIRST DAILY NEWSPAPER


n December 9 1793, Noah Webster established the first daily newspaper in New York City. A graduate U of Yale and one of the early trustees of Amherst College, Webster was better known for his lexicography, but he went to New York to edit the American Minerva (later the Commer cial Advertiser) as a way to support Washington's administration. News was powerful stuff However, Henry Austin Dobson (1840-1921) later wrote in "A Pleasant Invective Against Printing, that "The Press is too much with us, small and great, 7 We are undone of chatter and *on dit* [one says], / Report, retort rejoinder, repartee / Molehill and mare's nest fiction up to-date
