Trade sentiment was steady to firm. Retail demand was slow to instances moderate, best for other holiday items. Food service was light to good, best for catering businesses, restaurants, and fast food. Supplies of smaller sized product was in good balance and at times held with confidence, heavier weights were readily available. Spot locations were running part time schedules which kept floor stocks parallel with seasonal demand. In the parts structure, trading was light to active. Breast items were mixed, but available and in the best position, wings were balanced and clearing, and dark meat was at least adequate. In production areas, live supplies were moderate at mostly desirable weights.

Prices declined two cents on all sizes in most areas. The market tone was barely steady to weak. Demand into all channels was light to mostly moderate, slightly better where features were in progress. Supplies ranged available to sufficient for current requirements. Breaking stock demand was light for adequate to ample offerings. Light type fowl were at least sufficient for the light to fair demand. Processing schedules were normal to less than normal.

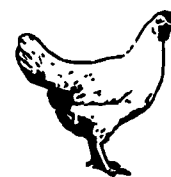
