Over 97 percent of the run went to slaughter, although the demand was only moderate as the light supply made it difficult to put any numbers together. On the light run, slaughter pigs did trend with a lower undertone. All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weights. Compared to last Monday, barrows and gilts sold .50-1.00 higher on another fairly light run. The quality of the run was good right from the beginning, with bidding relatively active through the entirety of the sale. Demand was good for all classes and remains especially good on the 300-350 pounders. The Western terminal markets are kicking the week off with 220-270 pound barrows and gilts trading from 29.50-31.00; which is noticeably weaker than last week's close. Lean hog futures were mixed Monday, with the February contract closing at 53.55; up 5 cents.
