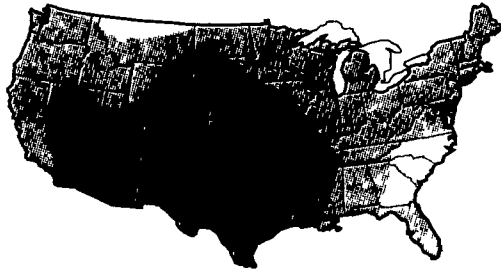

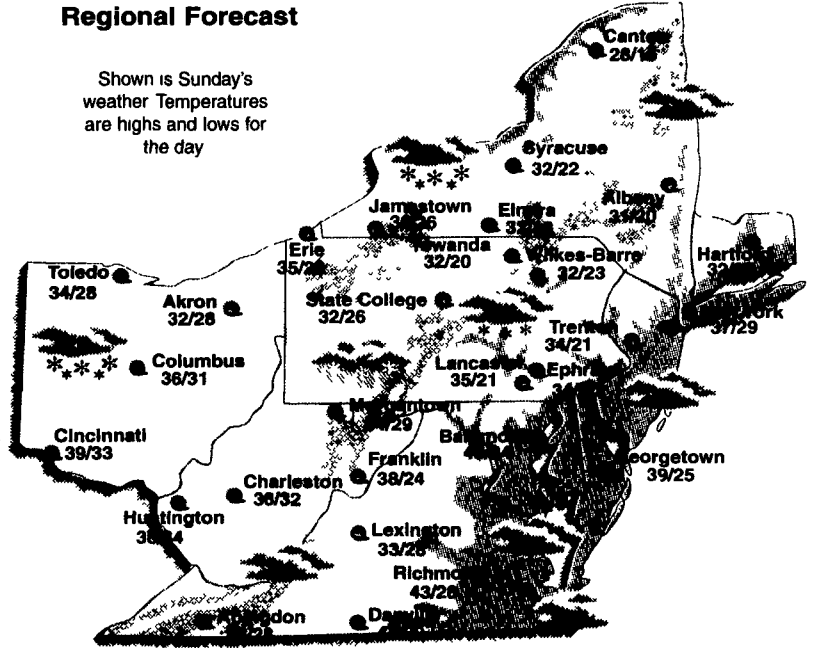

Farming Forecast

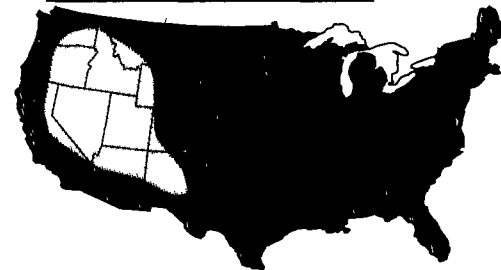

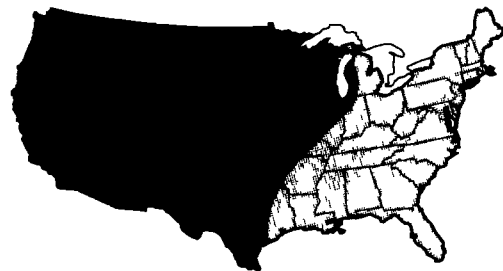

30-Day Temperature Outlook

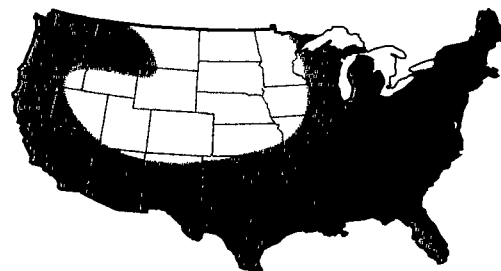
