


# 4-H **HAPPENINGS**

#### Wavne County 4-H **Horse Show Winners**

Wayne County 4-H horse members received seven awards at the 43rd annual State 4-H Horse Show in October at the State Farm Show Complex in Harrisburg.

County winners in 4-H performance classes were: Jennifer Adamitis of Wayne County Highsteppers 4-H Club, first place pleasure pony driving, second place in the open trail ponies, and fifth place in western pleasure ponies; Kyla Drinkwater of Horse Lovers 4-H, with a sev-

enth in western pleasure ponies; Steven Schwartz of Wayne County Highsteppers with a sixth in hunter hack horses; Jacob Sexton of Countryside Riders earned sixth place in draft horse driving and Kristy Gelatt of Wayne County Highsteppers taking 10th place in hunter hack ponies.

Several other Wayne County horse club members received recognition in the state contest; they were Kendra Merrigan and George Millen of Chaps and Breeches, Brita Krempasky of Saddle and Skedaddle, Lucie Henry and Grace Nebzydoski of the Wayne County Highsteppers.

"The competition gave 4-H'ers an opportunity to display their horsemanship skills," says Wayne County 4-H agent Ed Pruss. "The primary purpose of the state 4-H horse program is to develop life skills in youth and skills in horse management. Through competition, the 4-H'ers develop riding skills, gain self-confidence and learn proper care of animals."

#### **Northampton County 4-H Dairy Beef Project**

Would you like to raise an animal as a 4-H project? Why not begin with a Dairy Beef Project? You might be wondering what is a Dairy Beef? A Dairy Beef is a castrated bull calf from a dairy cow. The calf must be the offspring of two dairy breed parents (examples include Holstein, Brown Swiss, or Milking Shorthorn).

The calf is purchased in January and cannot be more than one week of age when acquired. This project ends in August when the animals are feeder calves. The 4-H member will be able to sell their Dairy Beef, and the buyer will return them to a farm to be finished. The meat from a Dairy Beef is generally leaner, and has a place in the market for lower fat red meat.

If you think Dairy Beef might be for you, contact Kelly Weisner in the 4-H office at (610) 746-1970 for more information. The animals need to be purchased in January, so you will need to contact a dairy farmer immediately.
