HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — For the first time, the Pennsylvania FFA Foundation is going to auction off the first in production tractor from the 10th in the foundation's Limited Edi-

A 2002 John Deere 4450 will be sold at the state Farm Show on Jan. 14 during the 4-H and FFA Junior Livestock Champions Auction.

This tractor is the fifth John Deere in the Pennsylvania FFA Foundation Series and the last John Deere Tractor the state FFA Foundation Board is offering. The box of the tractor includes line drawings of all the previous John Deere models.

The tractor's highest bidder will receive a letter of authenticity framed for display, a champion banner, and all the media

publicity that goes along with being a top bidder at the Pennsylvania Farm Show. A display case will be included to protect this valuable investment.

Production of these tractors was made possible through Tractor Supply Company's first-ever support of Pennsylvania FFA at a state level. The tractor supply logo is on the box.

The Pennsylvania FFA Foundation began their Limited Edition tractor series in 1992. The four of the first five tractors were Farmall models with the fifth being an International. The John Deere Series began in 1998 with the production of the John Deere B replica model. While many of the earlier models are sold out, limited quantities of the remaining tractors will be on sale at the Pennsylvania FFA Foundation booth, near the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture display in the original main exhibition hall of the Farm Show Complex.

# State Treasury Staff Members To Maintain Booths At Farm Show

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — State Treasurer Barbara Hafer has announced representatives from treasury will be at the 87th Annual Pennsylvania State Farm Show, returning cash and other assets to attendees and assisting farmers with information regarding liquid fuels tax returns and low interest loans.

Representatives from the Unclaimed Property Bureau will be at Booth 5153 in the main exhibit hall from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Jan. 11 through Jan. 18. The staff will be equipped with laptop computers to determine if visitors have unclaimed property. A notary will be available to expedite the claims process. Staff at the booth also will have information on AgriLink, the state's low interest loan program to help farmers prevent pollution from animal wastes. Additionally, brochures on other treasury programs will be available.

Representatives of Treasury's Board of Finance and Revenue will be at the adjacent Booth 5152 in the main exhibit hall from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Jan. 11 through Jan. 18. They will be available to answer questions about liquid fuels tax returns for farmers. The Board issues refunds for taxes paid on fuels used for commercial agricultural purposes. These refunds are authorized under a state law that allows reimbursement of the state tax

paid by farmers for gas, diesel and other fuels. Farmers not registered with the board may do so at the Farm Show booth. Each year the Board processes thousands of claims and returns millions of dollars to Pennsylvania farmers.

"Whether it's returning unclaimed property to the rightful owners or aiding Pennsylvania farmers," Hafer said, "attending events like the Farm Show help us find people who wouldn't typically find us."

"Anyone who wants to find out if they have unclaimed property can visit our Website, www.patreasury.org, and check the entire on-line database," Hafer said. "We estimate one in 14 Pennsylvanians is entitled to unclaimed property, and the average claim is \$1,000; so it's well worth checking."

Treasury's on-line database includes more than one million unclaimed property accounts ranging in value up to hundreds of thousands of dollars. There is a total of more than \$669 million on Treasury's unclaimed property books. Persons without Internet access can request a search by calling 1-800-222-2046.

Hafer said the Treasury is re-

turning record amounts of unclaimed property — as much as \$2 million a month — but said Treasury receives far more, about \$6 million a month.

The property comes from businesses and organizations that, under Pennsylvania's unclaimed property law, must turn over to the state assets abandoned for five years. Included are dormant bank accounts, stocks and dividends, uncashed payroll or accounts payable checks, uncollected utility deposits and unredeemed gift certificates.

#### **Milk Marketing Board Announces December Class I Price**

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — The Milk Marketing Board (MMB) announced the prices to be paid to Pennsylvania dairy farmers for December Class milk (beverage) as an average of \$14.57 in the western areas of the commonwealth, and an average of \$15.06 in the central and eastern areas of the commonwealth.

These prices do include the over-order premium of \$1.65 per one hundred pounds of milk.

Farmers, whose milk production is pooled under a federal order, will receive a marketwide blend price based upon the value of all classes of milk. However, the blend price received will vary as the component composition of a farmer's milk differs from the established benchmarks of 3.5 percent butterfat, 2.99 percent protein, and 5.69 percent other




