> is excellent for recharging groundwater. The weather so far this winter, when it comes to precipitation, is just about the opposite of last year when the winter months were so dry."

> Gov. Schweiker first declared a drought emergency for 24 counties in southcentral and southeastern Pennsylvania on Feb. 12, 2002.

> Of the state's 67 counties, only a dozen escaped being in a drought emergency, drought warning or drought watch at some point after Feb. 12 of last year.
