We are a shifty bunch. In a spare room upstairs stands a very large, plastic bag. This bag is stuffed so full that it stands by itself, layered with an assortment of blankets, comforters, afghans. None of them is new. Most of the layers, in fact, lean toward the scruffy side. Still, each possesses the promise of plenty of warmth potential despite worn edges and frayed corners.

American Cancer Society Kicks Off Daffodil Days

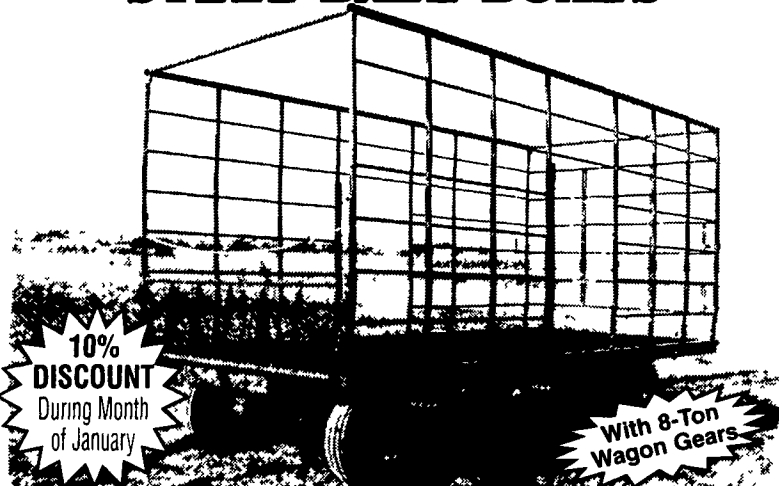
